Epic Firsts

In celebration of BCC Members' love of cars and the adventures they have in them! Thank you to all our contributors!

First British Car... And Then Some!

To begin, you should all know by now that I grew up around British and other unusual cars. For as long as I can remember, my dad always had something old, unusual or at least interesting. I can recall as a youngster, probably around third grade or so, pulling a Pierce Arrow out of a barn near Holland N.Y. This was right after World War II. This car was eventually sold after getting it running and cleaning it up. The next was a Singer – the mystery car from a few months ago. This was traded for a MG TC, black with the shires green upholstery and grill slats. This was, I'm sure, the first MG TC in Western New York – around 1947 or '48. Over the years we had a succession of, I believe, ten or eleven MG TCs including the one I have at present. This one was somewhere in the middle of the group. (I don't recall exactly.) All this time, we also had a Pierce Arrow twelve cylinder convertible, a Packard twelve and a straight eight, a duel cowl LaSalle phaeton, an S type Mercedes Benz (1927), a Bugatti and such things as Jaguars, one Morgan, a Volvo P1800, a Ferrari and some I can't recall. I learned to drive on a MG TC and a Volkswagen Bug so over the years I drove a lot of different machinery.

My first sports car was a 52 Porsche which had a really bad case of tin worm and then a busted engine. At the time I was going to school, I purchased a MG Magnette saloon – a lovely little car with real leather seats, burled walnut trim inside, MGA running gear and four speed box. I loved it and wish I could find another because it was quite comfortable but still unusual. After selling that, I purchased a beautiful Triumph TR3 that I drove all through the service, making the Buffalo to Boston trip some ten times in a year and a half. (That's ten over and ten back, at least 8 hours each.) After the service and finally working, I acquired the



MG TC that I still have. Over the years I have done what I call a home restoration and have done all the work myself except the paint. As of 2024, I have owned it 59 years which includes swapping out a frame, two engine rebuilds, and numerous tune-ups, updates, electrical

gremlins, etc. I also had a beautiful, salt free '69 TR6 which I owned about thirty some years and stupidly sold. I would buy it back in a second. I'm still looking for something interesting to replace it. However, as much as I would like it, a basket case at my age is not a good idea! (Photos are from the author's personal collection.)



1927 Mercedes Benz S straight six with single overhead cam and blower. Four speed crash box. Could easily do 100 mph and would be just loafing. I was with my dad when he got a speeding ticket in Angola but another time we passed a trooper on the Thruway, I was following, over 80 mph. He saw it and ignored it. Lots of stories around this car - some funny, some

tragic but what a car and a blast to drive!

dad traded our Singer (2nd photo) for the TC in '48.



1961 Fiat Abarth Zagato is just what it says... The car is Fiat based with performance im-



provements by Abarth and body by Zagato. It winds up as a 750 cc and would do just short of 100mph. Very light ,but quick, because of the power to weight ratio. That is my dad standing next to it and my mom sitting in it. She was a real trooper; she always drove "odd" cars we had.



1958 TR3 I drove all through the service including ten trips to

Chelsea, MA, ten trips back, and around quite a bit of New England. Stupid me - I sold it.




