As usual, they missed a big one; Brian Neri, of Boston N.Y, who was long time member of the British Car Club, passed away in early December. Brian was an avid car guy but it did not end there. He was also into flying and owned his own Taylor Craft that he was learning to fly. He was also active in Military



history, and taught history at Lafayette High School for many years. December's Mystery Car

OK, the mystery car for December is a Bugatti; that I think you will know. But here is the question... Who knows the story of this car and its connection to Western New York? YES, there is a big connection and I will fill you in come January. Clue: ARCA.



The Story: To begin with, if you are a sports car enthusiast you should really know a little of the history of the happening. Most think it a happened right after the end of WWII but it really goes back further than that.

In the early 1930s a couple of teenagers started a club called the Overlook Racing Club. These teenagers were the Collier brothers and the group expanded and eventually became the ARCA or Automobile Racing Club of America. They started out racing what we would call go karts or jalopies today. As things progressed their equipment became better and actual races were started on street courses. Alexandra Bay NY was one of the early events as well as one in Marston Mills on Cape Cod and a few others. As the equipment became better and more unusual some real sports or racing cars made an appearance. Some of these members owned some of the first MGs imported into the country like J2s and later P types. There Was an Alfa Romeo or two, a Maserati and of course Bugatti's. The club had at least three Bugs including the one that raced at Watkins Glen in 1948 in the hands of Bill Milliken that flipped over and gave his name to the corner. The club was growing quickly and they even put on a race at the World Fair in New York in 1938. Sadly at the start of WWII the club was disbanded and was never restarted although attempted. Hence when SCCA was started it mushroomed quickly.

Many of the ARCA cars still exist and are being vintage raced but several over the years "disappeared." The American Bugatti Club keeps tabs on all the Bugatti's in the States but one particular type 37 was missing for over 40 years. This car had a Ford B block engine fitted and was raced at many of these early events. Several people had been looking for this car for years but no luck. When the owner, who lived locally, decided to sell the car he contacted the American Bugatti Club and the rest is history. The car is still being raced (I have seen it) and has been the object of several articles in motor magazines over the last few years. In particular find a copy of *Hemmings Sports & Exotic Cars*, March 2007 or get a copy of *American Road Racing the 1930s* by Joel Finn for the complete story of the club from the very beginning.
